For more than 50 years, John Straayer has been a fixture in CSU's political science classrooms and the hallways at the Colorado State Capitol. He directed the department's Legislative Internship Program for more than 40 years. Today, he is a professor emeritus in political science. He exemplifies the ideals of the scholarteacher-civic servant and is deeply committed to the ideals of academic freedom and shared governance as a foundation of the University's excellence and advancement of American civil

CSU IN D.C.

The Straaver Center and the Department of Political Science have collaborated with The Washington Center to create an undergraduate semester in Washington D.C. Students will enroll in 15 credits through CSU and complete a professional internship, seminar, and colloquium. CSU enrolls up to 10 upper-level undergraduate students in this program. The program is open to students in all colleges and majors.
